"All the Jewish people should mourn the burning..."


In our weekly Torah reading, the two elder sons of Aaron pass away in a rather unusual manner. In tendering an unsanctioned offering, they violated the sanctity of the sanctuary. Or in normal language, they did some stuff in the temple that they weren't allowed to. They got burned. Literally. From the inside out. The Torah then instructs the entire nation to mourn the burning.

Why should they care? Well, OK, they should care. But why mourn? Mourning is usually reserved for close relatives, or NBA stars. What is the Torah teaching us by telling everyone to mourn for Aaron's sons?

In oanother place, the Torah says that God is trust-worthy, and does not do injustice (in case you're wondering, it's in Deuteronomy 32:4). What does that mean? If God is trustworthy, then it means he's not ripping anyone off. So why does it say specifically that God doesn't do injustice? That's like saying teenagers with phones have poor social skills. Super obvious!

The great Chofetz Chaim (no, that isn't a person's name- it's the nickname of a great Rabbi because it's the title of his most popular book) explains the concept beautifully. When a human judge passes judgment, they do their best to be truthful and accurate. So if someone commits a serious crime and the judge sentences him to, say, 20 years in prison; that may be an appropriate sentence for


