you describe the president as being in charge of half the country? What about Roger Goodell as being the commissioner of the AFC? Simba as being the king of a small section of jungle? That would be missing something, and probably disrespectful, too. So listen to this and tell me what you think.

Abraham is hoping that his son Isaac will find the right wife, so he has a serious conversation with his apprentice/ servant/ student/ protege/ lieutenant Eliezer. He charges Eliezer with the mission to seek out and bring back the perfect wife for Isaac. Abraham is so concerned that he find the right girl, that he makes Eliezer swear to him not to bring back a wife from among their Canaanite neighbors. A few guestions jump out. First of all, he trusts Eliezer so completely, why make the man swear? Secondly, the oath he makes Eliezer takes is by "the God of the Heavens." Well, that's odd. Abraham and Eliezer know very well that our God is the God of EVERYTHING. The heavens. the Earth, the swimming pools, the malls in the cities and the potato farms in Idaho. Why swear just to the God of the heavens? I know the heavens are big

but why leave anything out? Finally, what was Abraham's big problem with Isaac marrying a local girl? Perhaps they weren't great people. But have you met Abraham's relatives in Aram? They were horrible people themselves! Rebecca was an exception to the rule.

I often buy electronics for camp. Digital cameras, mp3 players for the bus, laptops or printers for the office staff, a drone as a prize. If you go to IDK, say wish.com or some other cheapo website, you're bound to find super cool electronics for a fraction of the price of what you'd pay for the Apple or Samsung equivalent. Features? Abraham understood that the people of his native homeland were not acting properly. They worshipped foreign gods, wrere immoral in their relationships and dishonet in business. But he understood that in their core, there was a quality there that could productive a Rebecca. True, they weren't all great and Rbecca was an exception, but the seeds were there. The inherent character traits existed in the family to produce an Abraham and to produce a Rebecca. Whereas the Canaananananaanites (I never can seem to get the spelling right) could never produce a ling lasting, quality product.

Abraham uses the term "God of the Heavens" as a reminder that even before he (Abraham) began to spread knowledge of God here on Earth, when God was only known in the heavens, there was already a core of goodness in his family (the descendants of Shem) that could not exist in the descendants of Cannaananannanan.

CHAYEI SARAH

- The parsha's title literally means 'the life of Sarah'.
- After 127 wonderful years, and after raising the incredible Isaac to adulthood, our matriarch Sarah passes away.
- Abraham finds the perfect place to bury Sarah, and names a gas station after its location.
- Abraham pays 400
 silver shekels for the
 burial spot where
 most of our 'founding
 fathers and mothers'
 would eventually be
 buried. Incidentally,
 400 silver shekels

is also about the price of a gallon of gas in California (hence the gas station naming. ohhhhhh).

 It's time for Isaac to get married, so Abraham sends his trusted assistant, Eliezer, to select a perfect wife for Isaac. He's told not to choose someone from the local Canananananananites.

e Eliezer does his job [at a] well, and discovers Rebecca, who is kind enough to give water to Eliezer and his camels.



After some negotiation with Rebecca's father and brother, Rebecca accompanies Eliezer back to Israel to meet Isaac.
